After the structural changes made last year Bayside's senior squads have had a very successful year. 13 swimmers qualifying for Nationals open water and pool across all age groups, male and female. The changes that were made last year helped to form a strong work ethic amongst all of the senior group and helped forge a stronger more professional relationship between the coaching staff and athletes. Both John and I are pleased with they way the swimmers are training.

This has been our most successful year for the junior program with over 35 swimmers competing at ALL Juniors. Along with the Super Squad (10 swimmers) the future of the club looks strong.

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The By- Laws below shall be read in conjunction with the current Constitution of the Bayside Swimming Club Inc.

1) RACING RULES

1. Swimmers must be financial before being eligible for any Club Aggregates or Awards.
2. Any points accrued between 1 May and 31 October will be forfeited if subscriptions are not paid by October.
3. To be eligible for any Club Age Championships, swimmers must have competed in 3 swim meets conducted by the Club, Metropolitan District South or Swimming Victoria during the current season.
4. Points allocations:
 - (a) For Championships

1st - 12 Points	5th - 4 Points	One point will be awarded to ALL other competitors not disqualified.
2nd - 8 Points	6th - 3 Points	
3rd - 6 Points	7th - 2 Points	
4th - 5 Points	8th - 1 Point	
 - (b) For Aggregates

As published with swimming program or as follows:
One point for competing in the race even if disqualified
One additional point for completing the race without disqualification
Two additional points for race time better than previous best time

In any event where points are deemed to be allocated for placing's,
Additional points maybe awarded for
1st placing overall - 3 Points
2nd placing overall - 2 Points
3rd placing overall - 1 Point
5. For Club Age Championships, swimmers can compete only in their own age group. Championship age groups will be swum as 6/U, 7/8, 9/10, 11/12, 13/14, 15/16 and 17/O. Age to be calculated as from the first day of the meet.
6. The Open Club Championship will be decided by a Special Competition run for the fastest swimmers (as decided by the Swimming Sub-Committee) irrespective of age or attendance at Club Activities. The Open Club Championship may be run in conjunction with the Club Age Championships, in which case the results will be determined from the times of those swimmers aged 13 years and over. A first place perpetual trophy and a personal medal will be awarded to the Club Champion, male and female.
7. The decision of the Referees is in all cases final.

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8. Club races will be conducted in accordance with Swimming Victoria Incorporated rules. For non-championship events, the club referee may exercise discretion to caution a swimmer about rule infringements, rather than disqualify the swimmer.
9. If considered necessary, the syllabus and daily programme may be altered from time to time at the discretion of the Swimming Sub-Committee.
10. If heats are necessary for races, final results may be decided on times. Heats are to be graded at the discretion of the handicapper.
11. Unless swimmers are in the Assembly Area when called for their race they may be deemed to be absent and may not be permitted to swim in another heat of the event. Swimmers not registered by the advertised starting time may be ruled as absent for the first race and not permitted to swim in another heat of the event.
12. Club members are expected to conduct themselves in an orderly manner whilst at the pool or at any other Club Activity and are bound by the rules and regulations as set down in these By-laws, or as set by the Pool management and by Swimming Victoria.
13. Water Polo registered players must be financial and registered with Swimming Victoria before being eligible to swim in BSC Inc. competitions. Financial members of BSC Inc. Water Polo Club may join the Swimming Club by payment of the Swimming Victoria registration fee.
14. Awards for Aggregate competitions will only be made to swimmers with a minimum of 10 points in the particular competition being assessed.
15. Where swimmers gain an equal number of points in any competition awards will be made as follows:
For Championships and Aggregates -
first, second and third placing will be awarded to all swimmers with equal number of points without any count backs being applied.

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2) CRITERIA FOR APPOINTMENT OF LIFE MEMBERS

1. The person may be nominated by any two financial members of the club who are eighteen years of age or over.
2. A nomination, signed by those nominating the person, shall be made in writing and be presented to the general committee of the club for consideration.
3. The person being nominated may not necessarily be a financial member of the club at the time of nomination, but shall be of good standing in the club and in the community in general, and shall meet one of the criteria (a) to (d) below:
 - (a) Have been a member of the club for not less than ten years, and
Have held executive or senior management positions within the club for not less than six years, and
Have represented the club at Swimming Victoria and/or District level as the club's delegate for not less than one year.
 - (b) Have represented the club, in a natatorial sport, at the Open National Championships on not less than three occasions.
 - (c) Have represented Australia at the Commonwealth or Olympic Games in a natatorial sport.
 - (d) Have represented Australia as a member of a representative team on two occasions in international competition in a natatorial sport.
4. The Committee (as Bayside Swimming Club Committee , General Manager and General Managers assistant may make the appointment of new Life Members at any time. However all such appointments must be confirmed at the next Annual General Meeting.
5. All present and past life memberships, bestowed by virtue of service to precursor clubs which have merged or amalgamated into the present club, shall be deemed to be valid Life Members of the present club.
6. A register of Life Members shall be established and maintained with the date of appointment and date of death as applicable.

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3) MEMBERSHIP FEES (SWIMMING)

1. A person who applies for and is approved for membership as provided in the rules is eligible to be a member of the Club on payment of the annual subscription payable under these rules.
2. All members are required to be registered with Swimming Victoria (SV) each year. The Bayside Swimming Club fee incorporates the Swim Vic fee.
3. Annual subscriptions shall be set for the classes of memberships detailed below. There will be no subscription fee set for Life Members of the Club or for Club Committee personnel.

4. All membership fees are due upon joining and are renewable from 1 May each year. They must be paid within four (4) weeks of first swim and in all cases on or before 31 October each year, otherwise membership ceases.
5. Swimmers will not be registered until payment of the applicable fee has been received.
6. At the discretion of the General Manager or General Managers assistant a family discount can be applied to second and subsequent competitive members from the same family. The amount of the discount is variable, dependent on the fee applicable to the category the swimmer would otherwise be in.
7. All fees consist of outgoing charges and a Membership charge. The Outgoing Charges consist of Swimming Victoria charges for registration and insurance, Swimming Australia registration, District South Capitation Fee and a pro-rata amount for the Club's affiliation with Swimming Victoria and District South., The Membership charge covers costs incurred by the club, and includes pool hire, Interclub, relay teams at State and National Championships and the costs associated with supporting a team at National level competition. It also covers the general administrative costs of running the club.
8. For swimmers transferring mid-season from another club, the Swimming Victoria registration fee does not apply, but a Transfer fee must be paid. The membership fee shall be based on the other subscription components. Please contact the General Manager's Assistant for further details.

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9. An Application for membership of the Bayside Swimming Club must be made using the 'on-line' membership system offered by Swimming Victoria. Known as 'Clubs On Line'. All Membership fees paid via "Clubs On Line" incur a 6% processing fee. This processing fee is set by IMG E-commerce. Further increases in processing fees may be made by IMG E-commerce and at the discretion of the managing committee of the Bayside Swimming Club fees may be adjusted to account for this. The 2009 -2010 fees, as set by the Bayside Swimming Club, absorb the 6% administration fee set by IMG E-commerce. Applicants without credit card facilities may pay the fees due direct to the General management.

4) MEMBERSHIP FEES (WATER POLO)

Will be determined when water polo teams are reformed.

5) POLICY ON RELAY SELECTION

The purpose of this policy is to enable the selection of relay swimmers to be an easily understandable process for swimmers, parents and coaches. In consultation with Bayside Swimming Club Coaches and Committee Members, it has been deemed that the following policy will be followed except in the case of Winter and Spring Interclub.

The selection of relay team swimmers will be solely the role of the coaching panel, giving due consideration to availability, past times, current times and team balance. The intention is that the fastest swimmers available will be selected to represent Bayside Swimming Club and the coaches may at any time run time trials if required to determine positions in the relay team and may also select swimmers out of their age group if they are considered the fastest.

Once the team has been selected it is expected that all swimmers, parents and members of Bayside Swimming Club will respect the coach's decision and support the members of the relay team. At no time will parent interference either before or after selection be tolerated.

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6) PROVISION FOR NATIONAL SWIM TEAMS

The club will reserve funds each year to assist its swimmers in representing the club in National or International competition.

Funds will be allocated to competitions with the following priorities:

1. Australian Age Championships
2. Australian Open Long Course and Short Course Championships
3. Australian Open Water Championships
4. Any other Interstate or International competitions at the discretion of General Manager, General Managers assistant and Committee as the managing entity of The Bayside Swimming Club.

Bayside Aquatics Committee as the managing entity of the Bayside Swimming Club shall appoint National Team Manager(s) who will have the following responsibilities:

1. Management of the National Team budget approved by General Manager, General Managers assistant and Committee as the managing entity of the Bayside Swimming Club . If needed, two members of the Committee or General Manager, General Managers assistant may approve an expense.
2. Organisation of advance accommodation and transport bookings.
3. Liaison between team members, parents and coaches.
4. Management of all issues arising at a competition, in accordance with Club, Swimming Victoria and Swimming Australia policies.

The source of funds for the National team is to be the following:

1. 50% of any interest earned in the year from the Club's investment account(s).
2. 100% of the profit from any event designated by the committee to be a National fund raising event.
3. 50% of the profit from any non-specified fund raising event.
4. Money from the Club's general revenue where the General Manager, General Managers assistant ,or Committee as the managing entity of the Bayside Swimming Club deems this appropriate.

The priorities for spending of National funds are as follows:

1. The provision of local transport between the team's accommodation and the competition venue for competitors, coaches and team manager.
2. Payment of relay team entries.
3. Payment of Coach's and Team Manager's entry and pool deck passes.
4. Payment for team vehicle parking if needed.
5. Provision of a pack of swimming related items for team members.

Members of a Bayside Swimming Club National Team shall be provided with:

2 x Named Caps for each National Swim Meet that they are to compete in.

Each swimmer in a National Team shall be provided with a Bayside Swimming Club towel, drink bottle, bag and team t-shirt on an annual basis for the first National Team that they become eligible for.

6. At the end of the Club's financial year the General Manager, General Managers assistant or Committee as managers of the Bayside Swimming Club will decide what to do with any funds remaining in the National team budget. At its discretion it may (a) carry forward the funds to the following year (b) make grants to National team members on an equitable basis to defray the cost of attending National competition or (c) withdraw the funds for another purpose.

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6.1 NATIONAL TEAM MEMBER CODE OF CONDUCT

The purpose of this policy is to define acceptable behaviour standards for members representing the club at National Competitions, in particular where members are staying in accommodation booked via the club. The policy is designed to recognise the club's duty of care in providing a safe environment for its swimmers, and to be consistent with the Swimming Australia Member Protection Policy.

Whilst representing Bayside Swimming Club in a team environment at National Competitions, no team member shall engage in behaviour which would:

- Spoil the positive experience or safety of other team members and their families.
- Risk the reputation of the club or its ability to re-hire accommodation in the future.
- Breach relevant policies or codes of conduct specified by Swimming Australia and Swimming Victoria.

Specific behaviour which is banned:

- No team member shall consume alcohol or provide alcohol to other team members at any time whilst staying with the National team. It is recognised that some team members will be over the age of 18, but the policy must apply to all members of the team. This is to be regarded as a serious matter and there will be zero tolerance.
- No team member shall drop or throw any item from the balcony of the accommodation, including food and drink products.

Where any breach of this code of conduct occurs, the Team Manager will investigate the circumstances, in conjunction with coaches and parents as appropriate. Sanctions which may be applied include:

- A severe caution
- Withdrawal of the right to represent the club in a relay
- A ban on staying with the team at future National Competitions
- Further disciplinary action in accordance with the Member Protection Policy and SV Member Welfare Policy

7) SPECIAL GRANTS

The General Manager, General Managers assistant or Committee as managers of the Bayside Swimming Club may at its discretion provide funding to a club member to enable participation in a swimming related activity. The member or their parent must provide details of the relevant activity to the Committee, which will make its decision based on the worth of the activity and the Club's financial position at the time.

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8) Club Uniform

Club Members representing the Bayside Swimming Club at swim meets shall wear the Bayside Swimming Club uniform as follows:

- (a) Club t-shirt or polo top
- (b) Club Swim Cap
- (c) Club red swim bathers
- (d) Bathers of navy colour may also be worn only if they are considered professional racing equipment.

9) Transport and Providing Lifts

The Bayside Swimming Club does not support swimmers aged 18 years and over who have their Driver's License providing lifts to swimmers less than 18 years of age unless prior consent of the

passengers parents has been sort. The Bayside Swimming Club, its employees and volunteers will not be held responsible for underage members traveling in vehicles driven by other members aged 18 years and over. Travel to and from pools and other Club functions, is the responsibility of and at the risk of members.

10) District Meets

All Bayside Swimming Club Members shall be encouraged to participate in the following District events:

- (a) District Interclubs
- (b) Interdistrict (Winter Interclubs)
- (c) All Juniors
- (d) District Qualifying meets
- (e) District Championships

SWIM COMMITTEE

The General Manager, General Managers assistant shall oversee the management of the Bayside Swimming Club Operations.

A Committee of Management shall be formed and operating protocol developed.

The Bayside Swimming Club Committee shall consist of: 4 Committee Persons a General Manager and a General Manager's assistant (appointed by the General Manager)

The General Manager, General Managers assistant and Swim Committee will meet each Calendar month at such time and place as the committee may determine.

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BEACH CLUB HOUSE

NEW CLUBHOUSE

Bayside City Council have allocated to Bayside Swimming Club a site adjacent to the Half Moon Bay Surf Life Saving Club at Black Rock.

Plans have been submitted to build a new Bayside clubhouse which will in effect be an extension of the Lifesaving clubhouse. Grants from both Council and State Government sources have been approved for the construction. The club will incur some cost in the construction of the facility, but this should be well within our financial capability.

The club has had some discussions with Half Moon Bay Surf Lifesaving Club in relation to the sharing of the facility. It is likely that club members will have access to the facility on a regular basis for both social and sporting purposes.

It is likely that building will commence by October 2009 before the current building permit expires.
